A chamber choir with a difference



Founded in 1992, Kingfisher Chorale is an accomplished chamber choir of around twenty experienced singers. Over more than three decades we have built a reputation for ambitious programming, detailed ensemble singing and performances that range from mediaeval and Renaissance music to new commissions and world premieres.

The choir has achieved success in the BBC Choir of the Year competition, performed around the country and released recordings including the world premiere of Malcolm Arnold's John Clare Cantata. Under Musical Director Giles Turner, Kingfishers has also given the first two performances of the jazz-trio version of Will Todd's Mass in Blue.

Our small scale is part of our strength. Soloists are drawn from within the choir, while professional instrumentalists and ensembles are engaged where the repertoire requires them. This gives us the flexibility to move from finely balanced a cappella music to historically informed performances with specialist period players.

OUR MISSION

Bringing to life ambitious and rarely performed choral music from across the centuries, aspiring to reach new audiences to share exhilarating and engaging performances.

Keeping a musical heritage alive

Britain has an extraordinary choral tradition. For centuries, music for voices has been part of our churches, cathedrals, communities and concert halls, leaving us an exceptionally rich inheritance of choral music.

But a musical tradition survives only if it remains a living tradition. A score can be preserved in a library and a recording can capture a performance, but this music was written to be sung and heard. When works gradually disappear from concert programmes, we lose something from our shared musical life.

Extraordinary music deserves to be heard.

Kingfishers deliberately looks beyond the familiar.

We seek out music that deserves to be heard and bring it back into live performance: from the extraordinary riches of Renaissance polyphony and the colour and vitality of the Baroque to remarkable music from later centuries. This is not about performing obscure music for the sake of being different. We choose it because it is wonderful music.

Audiences do not need to recognise the title or know the composer beforehand to be moved, exhilarated or astonished by what they hear. Some of the most rewarding reactions come from people discovering music they had no idea existed.



Our ambition now is not simply to continue performing this repertoire. We want many more people to hear it.

More than 30 years at Leicester Guildhall



For more than 30 years, Leicester Guildhall has hired Kingfisher Choral to perform its Christmas concerts in one of the city's most historic and prestigious venues.

The concerts have become a fixture of our year and a highlight of Leicester's Christmas season. The Guildhall fills, audiences return, and we continue to be invited back. In 2025 our Christmas concerts sold 293 tickets, and we return for three performances again this December.

That longstanding relationship is important evidence of what Kingfishers already has: an established audience, a respected place in Leicester's cultural life, and a record of creating concerts that people want to attend.

Our 2024 performance of *Ay Andar!* showed just how much potential there is. This adventurous programme of Latin American Baroque music was performed with professional period instrumentalists and promoted beyond our usual audience.

It was precisely the sort of project Kingfishers exists to bring to the concert platform: exhilarating, rarely heard music, given the instrumental colour it deserves and presented as a distinctive event.

The contrast does not mean that one factor alone accounts for the difference: *Ay Andar!* combined unusual repertoire, professional period instruments and greater promotion. What it showed is what can happen when an ambitious musical idea has the resources behind it to become an event and to reach beyond our established following.

We know the audience is there. We want to reach it consistently.

That means investing not only in what happens on the platform, but in publicity and audience development: reaching people across Leicester and Leicestershire who enjoy live music but may never previously have encountered Kingfishers or the repertoire we perform.
